



# Zimbabwe Finalises Strong Athletics Squad for Mauritius as Coach Aaron Whyte Leads National Charge

*The National Athletics Association of Zimbabwe, has officially confirmed the Zimbabwean athletes set to represent the country at the forthcoming Southern Region Championships in Mauritius, with respected athletics leader Coach Aaron Whyte taking charge of the national contingent.*

The announcement has generated excitement across Zimbabwe's athletics fraternity as the country prepares to send one of its most promising youth squads to the regional showcase. *The team comprises rising sprinters, hurdlers, middle-distance runners, and relay specialists who have impressed during the recent NAAZ selection events, interprovincial championships, and school competitions.*

Far from being a Mauritius team, these are Zimbabwe's young stars travelling to Mauritius to compete against the best athletes from across Southern Africa.

*Coach Aaron Whyte has emerged as one of the key developmental figures in Zimbabwean athletics, particularly within junior structures.* Widely respected for his organizational discipline, athlete development approach, and technical understanding of youth athletics, Whyte has played an important role in identifying and nurturing emerging talent through provincial and national structures.

Recently speaking during the NAAZ Interprovincial Championships, Coach Whyte highlighted the depth of talent now coming through Zimbabwe's athletics pipeline and expressed confidence in the country's junior athletes.

Under his leadership, Zimbabwe heads into the Mauritius championships carrying growing regional confidence, especially after the country's recent surge in sprinting and relay performances on the international stage. Zimbabwean athletics has enjoyed renewed momentum following impressive performances from athletes such as *Thandazani Ndhlovu and Leeford Zuze, who were part of the historic Zimbabwe 4x400m relay squad that shattered long-standing national records and qualified for global competitions.*

The Mauritius-bound Zimbabwe squad is expected to compete fiercely across multiple categories, with several athletes already viewed as future senior national stars. Many of the selected competitors dominated at NASH championships, regional qualifiers, and NAAZ selection events held in Harare and Bulawayo.

The Southern Region Championships themselves remain one of the most important development competitions on the African athletics calendar, bringing together the region's top emerging athletes and serving as a critical stepping stone toward continental and world championships.

For Zimbabwe, this trip is about the country's athletics resurgence, building international exposure for young athletes, and strengthening the nation's long-term competitiveness in track and field.

As Team Zimbabwe prepares for Mauritius, attention will now focus on *Coach Aaron Whyte and his talented squad to see whether the nation's next generation can rise to the occasion and fly the Zimbabwean flag high on the regional stage.*



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
